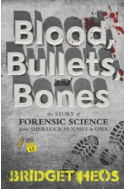

Compass South

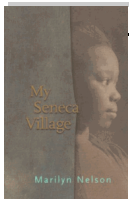

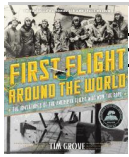
Camp Midnight

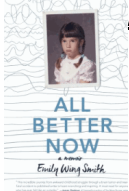
My Seneca village

M.P. Kozlowsky

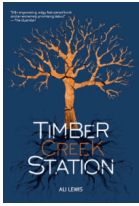

Taran Matharu

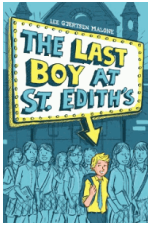

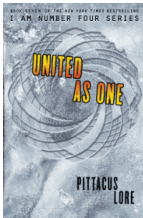

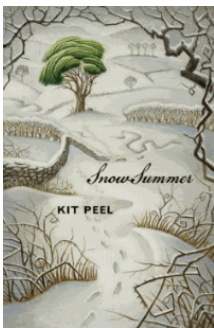
Seventh-grader Jeremy Miner, the only boy in a school of 475 girls, unleashes a series of pranks in hopes of getting expelled.
